# **Explanatory Notes.**

FOR many years the need of a permanent and suitable home for Masons in Chelmsford has been felt, and in 1922 a definite step was taken by the establishment of a Masonic Hall Fund by the Lodge of Good Fellowship No 276, a Reserve Fund having previously been inaugurated by Springfield Lodge, No. 3183. Owing to the difficulty of finance it was for some years found impossible to launch a satisfactory scheme, but in 1929, the General Purposes Committees of the two Lodges were called together to consider a proposal for the erection of a Temple in Rainsford Road, Chelmsford

Such proposal was discussed by Members of the Lodges meeting in the town and the Scheme was approved before the end of the year.

A Company was formed to carry out the Scheme and the building completed by October 1930.

The Structure has been erected from plans prepared by Bro, A. E. Wiseman, A.R.I.B.A., at a cost of approximately £3,500 and is entirely self-contained, the accommodation consisting of the Temple, 44ft. by 35ft designed solely for the purposes of Freemasonry and with seating capacity for 130 to 150, Entrance Hall and Anteroom, a large Committee or Crush Room divisible by a sliding partition, also ample Cloak room accommodation. Access to the Banqueting Room in the County Hotel is by a covered way.

The Hall, Ante-room and Committee Rooms are decorated in the Tudor style.

The decoration of the Temple is modern in feeling, all unnecessary moulding and decorative effects being omitted.

Reliance has been placed on the use of the Square, and the general effect has been obtained from the texture and the colour of the walls and ceiling, the coloured central dome, the eighteen pilaster panels, carrying Masonic emblems and the use of hidden lighting.

A pleasing feature of the Temple is the beautiful positive Organ placed in the South-East Corner. This is the gift of W. Bro. Stamp W. Wortley, the Chairman of Directors, and prime mover of the scheme.

The Temple seating consists of Benches specially designed and executed in oak, and arranged in tiers.

By reason of the substantial amounts of the Masonic Hall Fund, and Reserves of the Lodges of Good Fellowship No. 276, and Springfield No. 3183 respectively and the keen and ready support of the Brethren, the Directors are pleased to be able to announce that the capital required for the Building (as distinct from furnishing) is assured. Several Brethren have individually kindly presented items of furniture, and the Directors hope that others may follow their good example.

- 3. The Provincial Grand Master, accompanied by his officers, enters the Lodge attended by Grand Lodge Officers and having taken the Chair appoints his Officers.
